Dear Parents and Carers

Happy New Year! We hope you and your family had a lovely Christmas break and that you are now ready for a full and action packed first term of 2022.

Last term the children made great progress in becoming more independent and responsible for their own learning. Please can we ask for your support in reminding your child that they need to continue taking responsibility for bringing into school all that they need each day and to concentrate on their key skills (spelling, reading and times tables) at home each week. P.E kits should worn on a Monday and a Wednesday. Kit must include an outside top and tracksuit bottoms as PE continues outside, if possible, whatever the weather! This Term we will be actively involved in Hockey and Dance. There is a super opportunity for Year 4 to shine at the New Theatre in Oxford on **Tuesday 8**th **February.** This is a chance for year 4 to show to other schools in Oxfordshire their dance moves! Mrs Seymour will be leading this dance event and more details will follow shortly.

Our topic this term is Misty Mountains and Windy Rivers which provides great opportunities across the curriculum, especially in our English, Art and Geography lessons. Our class reading book this term "King of the Cloud Forests" also has a misty mountain theme which will further enable the children to explore the terrain of the Himalayas. A brief outline of our curriculum for this term is summarised below: (please note change of topic for science from last email sent out as now Cornerstones science is up and running.)

Music Music lessons, on composing and performing related to landscapes and focusing on the recorder to learn to play and compose music.	French Mrs Arkell continues to increase vocabulary with animals and writing simple sentences. Looking at the geography of France.

Homework

Your child has a Reading Record which they should aim to fill in daily. It is extremely beneficial for your child to read to themselves every day and with an adult at least twice a week. Please do record in the diary and check that they are commenting themselves. Comments can include use of prediction, expression, asking questions, learning new vocabulary or even the effort that they put in. Please also support your child in learning their times tables – by the end of Year 4 we would like children to know all the times tables 1-12. If your child is quick at recalling their multiplication facts, try challenging them with division facts. Your child has access to Times Table Rock Stars and UR Brainy which they can use both at school and home to really increase their times tables knowledge and speed.

English: Week 1 Google Classroom activity - Out on Wednesday. In on Friday

Spellings: Wednesday, tested the following Wednesday

Reading: Reading records will be checked weekly, usually on a Wednesday.

As part of our Mountains and river topic, children are very welcome to carry out some extra research at home on an area that interests them and bring it in to display in the class. However, this is not compulsory as extra work. There will be some ideas on the Home Learning page on the Year 4 web page.
