LAMDA lessons at Kidmore End 2021-2022

LAMDA lessons will be returning to Kidmore End in the Autumn Term. LAMDA examinations improve communication skills, increase self-confidence and develop strong social skills. LAMDA has been especially designed to provide an easy transition for all students to continue with or start Speech and Drama lessons from primary school upwards.

Exams are from Introductory to grade 8. LAMDA accredited examination at Level6 or above are recognised within the UCAS tariff system. There are currently a few places left for the first half-term in September.

25th June

Katy Hardman, head of science at MECE, came in to teach a science lesson all about plants. The children enjoyed conducting experiments using ethanol and iodine to test for the presence of starch in a leaf, proving that photosynthesis had occurred.

7th July

Trip to Harcourt Arboretum to support our science topic on plants. The children explored the arboretum on a scavenger hunt and took part in a workshop about different types of trees. They were fascinated by the giant redwoods, the monkey puzzle tree and the rare wollemi pine. The peacocks that roam the grounds also treated them to a full display of their tail feathers, which caused much excitement.

Year 6 activity week:

Year 6 had a fun filled week in June. During the week we had a day of team building activities; a day on the river canoeing, kayaking and bell boating, We went climbing at the Reading climbing centre. The week culminated with a walk from Henley to Kidmore End following a route we planned ourselves using OS maps.



In Foundation Stage...



On Tuesday the 29th of June Foundation Stage went on their first ever school trip to the Earth Trust. We took part in a Marvellous Minibeast workshop and had a marvellous day. We were fortunate enough to be one of the first schools to experience the newly built outdoor learning classroom and the children enjoyed stomping and running in the natural play area.

We learned about three different types of habitats- meadow, woodland and pond and discovered different minibeasts using the sweeping technique and pond dipping. We found many mini beasts including crickets, spiders, 16 spotted ladybirds, woodlice, mini frogs, newts and back swimmers. The children listened well and asked interesting questions, it was a wonderful day.

In Year 5....

Year 5 are enjoying maths outside the classroom. Activities include: measuring heights of trees, perimeter and area of field, number sequences, finding the volume of dens, identifying parallel lines that are not vertical and horizontal, looking for lines of symmetry, plotting points on an axis and hula hooping!



In Year 4...

Year 4 had a perfect day out earlier this term to conclude their topic on the importance of Henley on Thames today and in the past. The day included a boat trip down the famous Henley Royal Regatta rowing course, a walk around the town looking at some of the Tudor buildings and architecture and the day finished with delicious ice creams on Mill Meadows playing field.
