Around the school.... In Foundation Stage/Reception

In Foundation, we have been enjoying exploring even more of our resources. We have had lots of fun building towers with the big blocks and enjoying watching them tumbling down too! Our new focus book is 'Elmer' and we have been celebrating what makes each of us unique.

In maths we have been matching, sorting and comparing groups of different objects in preparation for our number work. This week we met Olly the Owl in our phonics lessons and he needs lots of help to sound out words. We have been helping Olly to blend sounds together to make words.



In Year 1

This week we have been very busy! We have been looking at phonics and handwriting and have been planning and writing our own version of The Three Little Pigs. In maths we have been learning about the days of the week, how to write numbers in words and we have learnt about the symbols + and = to start writing our own number sentences.

In PE we have been developing our rolls and balances to put together a sequence. In our topic, following our walk around Kidmore End we have been looking at maps of the local area to identify key landmarks.



In Year 2

We really enjoyed looking at the church and graveyard, where we saw the grave of Thomas Flower Higgins who was The Headmaster at Kidmore End a long time ago.

We also looked at other gravestones, they were very interesting. We found the war memorial and some family graves, some of them were very old.

We wrote wanted posters for the wolf in Little Red Riding Hood and had fun finding great adjectives to describe him.

This week we have done some amazing pastel drawing of places in Kidmore End and we were all very pleased with how they turned out.

In Year 3

Year 3 have been learning about the three different periods of the Stone Age, particularly how life changed for people living in the Mesolithic period. They also had their first recorder lessons and carried out an experiment in science.

We have been reading the story of Littlenose the Hunter. (Joshua)

We made cave paintings using pastels which was really fun and messy. We have been practising our joined up writing. (Emelia)

I enjoyed science because we closed the blinds and got the torches out to experiment with shadows. (Orla)

We have been learning about nouns, adjectives and adverbs and how to use them to write interesting descriptive sentences. (Lucy)

In Year 4

What we have been learning in year 4 By Isabella

It has been really great coming back to school and I have been reminded about how much fun it is mixing with other year groups in the playground and getting together in assembly again.

Clem said "I love being able to sing in assembly like we used to."

Mrs Thomas has been teaching us some really interesting things like: rounding to the nearest 10 in maths, learning about the Greek myth Theseus and the Minotaur in English and about the human skeleton in science.

Anthony = commented, "I really enjoyed making up my own Greek myth with my talk partner."

We were very lucky to have Mrs. Vipperla in our classroom to talk to us about Hinduism and we tried some traditional food. The girls were even given a little jewel on our foreheads called a bindi.

In PSHE we have been making human machines. The aim of this is to be able to work together and everybody takes part in the activity.

Ava added "I really enjoy doing activities together."

In French with Mrs. Arkell we have been learning the names of different countries, for example :England is Angleterre.

We have been learning something we have never done before which is playing the recorder. The three main notes we have been focusing on are B, A and G. We are also enjoying going swimming on a Wednesday when we take a coach to Queen Anne's.

Our topic is Ancient Greece and we are really excited about our class trip to the museum in a couple of weeks' time!





In Year 5

"So far in year 5 we have done a whole lot of exciting things. We have been looking at different forces in science, researching what life was like for working children during the Victorians and continuing to read 'Street Child' in English which also links to what we are learning about in topic.

Our favourite lessons so far in year 5 are Maths and English. We have enjoyed learning about place value and have moved on to addition and subtraction. We also enjoy English because we have been writing diaries and learning facts about Street Child."
