
Christmas Jumper day raised £143.70 Our Children in Need day raised £173.00

COVID precautions

Daily testing of close contacts for COVID-19 - updated guidance for schools

From yesterday, adults who are fully vaccinated and all children and young people aged between 5 to 18 years and 6 months identified as a close contact of someone with COVID-19, are strongly advised to take a lateral flow device (LFD) test every day for 7 days and continue to attend their setting as normal, unless they have a positive test result.

Daily testing of close contacts of COVID-19 will help make education and childcare settings safer and help keep children and young people in face-to-face education.

The school will continue to update you over the Christmas break if there are any changes to quidance from the DfE.

The children have enjoyed following the adventures of Nip and Nap in Phonics and we are all looking forward to a new adventure after Christmas. In Maths we have started to explore the composition of numbers and we are talking about how parts can make a whole. We have had great fun putting parts of a puzzle together to make a whole puzzle.

And in true Foundation Stage Christmas style, we have covered our world in glitter making festive decorations for the classroom and the Christmas tree.

In Year 1

This week we have been rehearsing for our Nativity play. The children have loved learning the songs. The performances to the school and the parents were wonderful. We have concluded our Childhood topic with a look at some very special events in the children's lives - from Christenings, arrivals of siblings or the celebration of a great nanny's 100^{th} birthday. There were wonderful things for the children to share, thank-you for sending in the photos.

In Year 3

Year 3 really enjoyed their taco making experience last week. The chopping up of all the vegetables proved to be quite a challenge, but once it was all cooked many of the children said it tasted delicious.





Impressively, lots of the class were willing to try vegetables that they hadn't eaten before and even found they liked them! In science, we are eagerly anticipating the results of the experiment that we set up last week, to test the effect of different drinks on tooth enamel. No real teeth were harmed in the creation of this experiment! - instead we used hard boiled eggs. The children have worked incredibly hard this term and so we are looking forward to finishing the term off next week with some festive fun and glitter.

In Year 4

In year 4 we have been very busy learning. In art and science, we have been making Christmas sleighs with a series circuit to make our bulbs work for headlights. Over the last couple of weeks, we have been decorating our sleighs and now they look amazing! The class made them all out of shoe boxes and we covered them in Christmas wrapping paper.



On Wednesday 1^{st} of December, the choir all went up to Oxford Town Hall to perform a Christmas concert called The Big Sing. We performed alongside other school choirs in front of hundreds of people.

In English we are writing a play script about an Anglo-Saxon family on their journey to England. Year 4 have been focusing on the key features of a play script for example, not using inverted commas for speech.

In Year 5

For the past two weeks, Year 5 have been focusing on perimeter and area in maths. They have worked hard to calculate the area of a range of shapes, as well as identifying the lengths of missing sides. They have also been looking at spherical bodies in space, using a range of evidence to explain how they know the earth is round.

Moreover, they created a visual aid to help identify different phases of the moon and they also enjoyed the latest SpaceX launch. Year 5 have worked really hard this term and are very much looking forward to a well deserved break!

In Year 6

This week we have been doing Maths and English tests some mornings. Some afternoons we made Christmas decorations (reindeers to hang on the tree) and Christmas cards. We also made a model of the lungs for science. This week we watched the Foundation and Year 1 play which we especially
