School Council Visit - St Joseph's College Creating our School Song

On 1st March, the School Council, Mrs Thomas and Mr Griffin travelled to St Joseph's College for a joint partnership project.

The School Council and the rest of the children at Kidmore End are very keen to have their very own 'School Song' which they can sing in assembly.

Working with Year 10 and Year 12 students from St Joseph's College our children shared their ideas about what the song should include and the style of song that we could eventually sing with pride once it has been composed by Year 10 and 12 students.

The group discussed initial ideas for the song. The pupils talked about the 'mind maps' they had worked on before half-term, the values that were important to them, such as friendship, respect and kindness, and the type of song they wanted. This is a brilliant opportunity for our School Council to work in partnership with St Joseph's College. The workshop was inspirational and we cannot wait to hear the music and lyrics for our Kidmore End School Song.

Around the school

In Foundation Stage/Reception

In Foundation we are thoroughly enjoying our new topic, Ready Steady Grow! We have had lots of interesting discussions about where food comes from and how it gets to the supermarkets. We have opened our very own fruit and veg shop in our classroom, which has been extremely popular. It is wonderful to see the children talking about their favourite fruit and vegetables although Mrs Hinnell has been quite shocked at the price of some of the produce- £100 for an avocado!!!! The children enjoyed a sorting activity this week, thinking about where food is sourced, we will be continuing this next week when we start to think about the packaging too. We are enjoying lots of singing, a favourite has been the classic Old McDonald had a Farm. Our home corner has come to life with some lovely donations- a big thank you to Mrs Bell, the conversations over picnics and tea parties are simply wonderful.

In Year 1

This week the children have had a busy week covering lots in phonics, writing and maths. In phonics the children are continuing to learn new sounds and consolidate learned ones.

In English they have been learning about directional language (in particular left and right) and imperative (or bossy!) verbs to write directions between London landmarks. They have enjoyed studying the map of London to see where the landmarks are. In maths the children have been learning about measuring and have begun to use rulers to measure in centimetres. They have been using the terms long, longer, longest and short, shorter, shortest.

In PE the children have been playing fun team games to learn about cooperation. In art the children have made weather motifs from natural materials.

On Friday the children will take part in a 'Traditional Tales' drama workshop which should be lots of fun!





In Year 2

Year 2 all had a good half term and were all glad to see their friends again after the break. We have been learning about fractions and planning exciting openings to our stories to engage our reader. In our coasts topic we have been learning about the RNLI and some of their exciting rescues, we all think they are very brave. We are pleased to see Mrs Bickerton again and are looking forward to getting to know her ready for when she will be teaching us. The highlight of this term so far has been World Book Day; we had some amazing costumes in our class. We had great fun doing the book scavenger hunt and other World Book day activities throughout the day. On Friday we are doing a 'Traditional Tales' drama workshop; we are sure it will be great fun.

In Year 3

Kidmore End School has introduced a new outdoor classroom and campfire. It is made of 6 tree trunks lying on their sides to make a circular shape.

We all got a big surprise seeing them there on the field next to the mound. Maya's Dad kindly contributed to this by cutting them to the exact size needed.

He brought them to the school on a truck with a small crane on the back. Maya said, "It was really noisy and I was worried that they would drop the logs but it all worked out fine in the end." Year 3 were the first to try out this new addition and cannot wait to hopefully be learning on them very soon.



In Year 4

We have had a very fun few weeks since half term here in Year 4. In a couple of days' time (10th March) we are going to the Oxford New Theatre to perform our dance of Wind in the Willows on stage. We have been practising very hard and are all really excited!

In Geography we are typing up a non-chronological report on rivers. We are trying to include geo-science facts, too. In addition, we are Googling pictures to include and adding a glossary.

In Science we are learning about temperature. In the first week back, we did an experiment where we put some ice in a mug with a thermometer and took the temperature every 15 minutes. After the experiment we recorded our findings on a graph.

On Friday the children in Year 4 are running a stall selling bracelets, cupcakes and other yummy treats to eat. This will be happening at 3pm in the playground. We have been working very hard to arrange this event and hopefully we will raise enough money to pay for more school equipment for children in Ukraine to help with their education.

In Year 5

In the last two weeks we have been doing all sorts of fun things including a fantastic school trip at Badgemore Primary School in Henley to watch an incredible Shakespearean performance of 'A Midsummer's Night Dream'.

Bobby and Emilia played fantastic parts in the performance.



For topics we have continued with 'Sow, Grow and Farm', as well as the lifecycles of a variety of animals and plants. We have also started to see our sunflower and courgette seeds begin to sprout.

Finally, a couple of us participated in a year 5/6 netball tournament. It was very rainy but that didn't stop us from having a great time!

In Year 6

For the past two weeks in Year 6, we have been preparing for an athletics competition. In maths we have been exploring the areas and perimeters of different types of shapes, such as: rectangles, triangles and parallelograms. Over the past couple of weeks, we have changed our science topic; we are now learning about electricity. In our last science lesson, we matched up scientific diagrams to their real picture and built working series circuits. Our humanities topic is frozen kingdoms and we have now started to learn about polar exploration. We chose an Antarctic explorer of our choice and researched their expedition to the continent. Our art linked to the frozen kingdoms topic and we did some animal Inuit carvings. In R.E we have been doing about Judaism and the importance of Bar Mitzvah and Bat Mitzvah to Jewish children. COVID 19 Update

Information for parents and carers on COVID-19 vaccination for at risk 5 to 11 year olds

Children aged 5 to 11 years who are in a clinical risk group or who live with someone who is immunosuppressed can get the COVID-19 vaccine, in line with advice set out by the <u>Joint Committee on Vaccination and Immunisation</u> (<u>JCVI</u>). Eligible children include those with diabetes, immunosuppression, learning disabilities, and other conditions as outlined by the <u>UK Health Security Agency</u> (UKHSA) in the Green Book.

Vaccinations help to increase protection against COVID-19, which is particularly important for those with underlying health conditions.

Further information is available in the <u>guide for parents</u> of children aged 5 to 11 years published by UKHSA. We have published some <u>frequently asked questions</u> on the vaccination programme including information on eligibility, accessibility and advice for parents of children at high risk from COVID-19.

Following <u>advice</u> from the JCVI, healthy 5 to 11 year old children will also be offered two 10 microgram doses of the COVID-19 vaccine. The NHS will prepare to extend this non-urgent offer to all children during April.
