

#### Around the school ....

#### In Foundation Stage/Reception

Foundation have been busy the last two weeks with their topic, 'ready, steady grow'. We were very lucky to be given some frog spawn and have been watching them very closely to see how they change into frogs. I'm not sure who was more excited when they hatched into tadpoles the children or Miss Morris!! We have also planted some beans using different methods to find out what they need to grow. Charlie brought some stick insect eggs in us to watch and grow but unfortunately, they still have not hatched. Last week Mrs Hinnell brought in various fruits to make a fruit salad. We all had a go at cutting it up (under adult supervision) and enjoyed eating it afterwards. Some of us even tried some fruits for the first time. In Maths we have been learning about doubles. We used positional language to match a butterfly's wings with a partner and have also learnt that we can sort items into different types of groups. In Phonics this week we have been revising the many diagraphs that we have learnt so far. Lastly we had a lovely surprise yesterday afternoon when our buddies from Year 5, came over to our class and read books with us.

#### In Year 1

This week the children have finished their Great Fire of London diary entries. They really enjoyed watching their replica houses burn down on the field and were really interested to see how fast the fire was able to spread. The children have gone on to produce some lovely writing to display in the classroom.



We have also finished our measurement topic in maths. The children have enjoyed measuring things with rulers, using balance scales to measure mass and getting hands on with water looking at capacity and volume!



Alongside this the children continue to be working really hard on their reading, phonics knowledge and handwriting.

On Thursday we will be finishing our 'Bright Lights, Big City' topic with a visit to Legoland and on Friday the children will be taking part in a football tournament, so PE this week focussed on football skills!

#### In Year 2

We have had a busy few weeks in Year 2. On Friday 11th March, we enjoyed a drama workshop about Jack and the Beanstalk. It was a lot of fun.

We are enjoying our topic about coasts and have been finding out about Whitby Bay. We have found about the jet that was found due to coastal erosion in and made into jewellery, a particular favourite of Queen Victoria.

We are planning our travel guides about Whitby Bay and are enjoying finding out about the many tourist attractions. We have been learning about texture in Art and have been experimenting with clay and paper to make different textures.

#### In Year 3

In English we have been planning and writing an adventure story with the help of a story mountain. A story mountain consists of a beginning, a build-up, a problem, a dilemma, a resolution and an ending. Our success criteria was to have a clear structure, expanded noun phrases, adverbs, prepositions, phrases and conjunctions to join idea and paragraphs.

In Science we have been learning how different magnets attract and repel each other depending on which poles you use. North and South attract while South and South repel. This week we learnt how to make our own compass and how to find magnetic north. It was lots of fun!

In Art we having been painting and drawing in the style of L.S. Lowry. We have all painted our own versions of school and then we stuck our drawings of Kidmore End school children on it. They look great.



#### In Year 4

Two weeks ago was Science Week and Year 4 did a really interesting experiment. Our task was to cut normal sized spring onions to 4.5 cm and put them into cups of 30 ml of water, and to record our data over two weeks, including: time, temperature, length and how much our plant has grown since the previous measurement (mm). Surprisingly, their lengths are very different! Some are now 9 cm and some are 6 cm. Most have been transferred to larger containers now as they have burst through the clingfilm that we put over the cups to protect the onions.

Maths week also featured last week and we were given the fun task to estimate how many pieces of popcorn remain in the popcorn machine after the discos. The person with the closest answer will be rewarded with 5 team points, and the person furthest from the answer will have to count the pieces! We also had to work out the amount of carpet needed to cover Year 4 classroom's floor! We've estimated (with calculations) about 43m squared.

In English and Geography we have been busy writing up river reports and now we have started doing the same for Mountains. Mrs Thomas certainly keeps us on our toes!

In Art we are making mountain models using cereal boxes and newspaper. Over the next week or so we are going to be including the water cycle in our creations including cotton wool for clouds. We can't wait to see the finished mountains.

#### In Year 5

Last week, Year 5 joined Year 6 on a trip to Leys Leisure Centre in Oxfordshire. It was a pleasure to be invited and we had a lovely time. There were multiple events such as obstacle, over under, various relays, long jump, chest push, vertical jump and triple jump. We placed sixth which is a fantastic achievement considering we were competing against older children.

We are doing our clarinets in Music this year and we had a talent show to reveal everyone's secret talents. Mrs. Robertson is our clarinet teacher and every week she comes in to help us develop a better clarinet understanding.

#### In Year 6

Last week, on Friday a photographer took his drone and videoed the school from the sky. We all took part in fabulous activities throughout the day such as: cooking, netball, football and art.

Year 6 have also been taking part in coding lessons with Mrs Bickerton. They use Lego and coding skills to create moving models.



#### In Year 3 and Year 4

As part of the Henley Youth Festival, Year 3 and Year 4 participated in Art workshops with a local artist. The children made individual geometric patterns from bright paper. Inspired by famous artist Jen Stark, the children produced some wonderful geometric and colourful designs.
