It has been a busy start to the new academic year with the children starting in their new year groups. We have welcomed our new Foundation Stage children to the school who have settled in extremely well.

The school is thriving with an increase in pupil numbers since 2021. We also have 6 Ukrainian children who have started the term incredibly well settling into the British schooling system and showing real resilience.

Our Open Mornings for our prospective parents have also been popular and we have had many families attending the school. The Year 6 children have been wonderful, taking the parents on tours and answering many questions. The Year 6 children are fabulous experts who are so proud of their school and they continue to be brilliant ambassadors for Kidmore End.

As we start the new year the school has introduced its new school vision. The Governing Body, along with support of Reverend James, who is also a member of the Governing Body, focused on developing a vision with new values that represents our school.

Around the school.... In Foundation Stage/Reception

We have loved getting to know each other in Foundation over the last few weeks. We are so impressed with how well the children are settling into school life and how they are coming into school in the mornings. We have been spending most of our time playing and exploring with the resources as we make new friends. Our games have included whose voice is that? and who's hiding under the blanket? There was a lot of laughter when it was Miss Morris' turn to hide! We have been sharing lots of stories and guessing what might happen next?

Our Rocket Phonics programme has begun and we are learning our first few phonemes. We are excited to hear what Nip and Nap are getting up to each day in the phonics Big Book. In Maths, we have been looking around inside and outside and 'noticing' what is the same and what is different. In our topic discussions we have been talking about going on journeys and our favourite places to explore. The children created some wonderful paintings of their fantasy worldswhat wonderful imaginations they have!!!!! We are looking forward to exploring our local area next week on our first school outing.

In Year 1

This week we have been looking at the story, The Three Little Pigs. The children have been ordering and retelling the story. In Maths we have been looking at 'greater than' and 'less than'. The children have been adding groups and then correctly using the greater than symbol (>) and less than symbol (<). The children have continued to learn new sounds in phonics and have been practising their handwriting. In PE the children have been learning an autumnal 'conker' dance and enjoying Multi-Skills on the AWP. In Art the children have enjoyed learning about primary colours and creating a colour wheel, and in computing they have been learning about different forms of technology and practising logging in.





In Humanities we have talked about different types of homes that people live in, for example terraced houses, semi-detached house and bungalows, ready for our walk around Kidmore End next Tuesday. Finally, this Tuesday the children enjoyed meeting PC Sue who talked to them about the role of the police. The children were very well behaved!!

In Year 2

We have really enjoyed our first few weeks in Year Two with our friends and mixing with the other children on the playground. The children have settled really well into class and into their new routines, taking on board their new expectations. In the classroom the children have been working super hard on their resilience and 'giving things a go' with long pieces of writing, maths and a new topic. They have enjoyed their introduction to our 'Movers and Shakers' topic which has introduced them to lots of new role models although we all agreed that King Henry VIII was probably not someone to look up to! The highlights of these past few weeks has definitely been starting new PE lessons in the hall on apparatus and becoming the top of the infants!

In Year 3

Year 3 has made an excellent start to the new school year. They have been exploring life in Stone Age Britain through the story Stone Age Boy and learning how to develop description in their writing.

In Science, they have been exploring the colour wheel and experimenting with mixing secondary and tertiary colours. In RE, they have been considering the character of Noah through the story of the flood. They also had great (messy) fun recreating cave art with pastels.



In Year 4

After a long and lovely Summer, the Autumn term got off to an exciting start by first welcoming our new classmates Ellie, Anna Mariia and Ivan.

Our Humanities topic this term is the Anglo Saxons we learned about the history of invasions of England and started our topic book Anglo Saxon Boy. Anglo Saxon boy is a story about a boy called Magnus whose father wants him to join the Army. His father is a king with lots of children all wanting his attention because he is often away fighting.

In English we have been reading Old Norse and Anglo-Saxon poetry and learning about Kennings, which are two words put together to describe what something is, without saying what it actually is, such as "bonebreaker" which means monster and "helmet-bearer" which means, a warrior. We then had lots of fun making up our own Kennings to describe ourselves.

In Mathematics we are doing place value and in times tables we are focusing on 3s and 6s. We have done thousands with number lines as well. We have also been introduced to a new website - "UR BRAINY" times tables, doing 3s, 4s and 6s.

In Art we are experimenting with water colours and learning all about colour wheels and primary colours and how to make secondary colours and tertiary colours by mixing them.

Our new Science topic is Food and the Digestive System and we started by learning about Ecosystems, and how they are made up of a group of plants and animals and tiny creatures, and what places they live such as deserts or oceans and what they need to survive - light or air, soil and water.

In P.E. we are playing tag rugby and Mrs Thomas has been working us really hard at circuit training. We are all having fun but please remind your children no earrings and watches at P.E.

In R.E. we are thinking about Hinduism, we are also very excited to try new Indian food this week coming! We have learned that they believe in one God with three aspects: Brahma - the creator, Vishnu - the Preserver, and Shiva - the Destroyer/Transformer.

In Music we have been listening to Peter and the Wolf and practicing music signs, and we are also playing the recorder.

In assemblies we heard about Queen Elizabeth's sad passing and listened to stories honouring and remembering her, and learned about the ascension of our new King, Charles III. We are focussing on kindness and also learned all about the NSPCC and how they help children have a proper life and not to be scared.



In Year 5

Year 5 have settled brilliantly into the new school year, enjoying school life in the Higgins building and the responsibility that comes with being in year 5. The children have been working hard, learning all about their new topic 'The Shang Dynasty', as well as investigating different climates in geography and different forces in science.

Moreover, Year 5 have begun to learn all about rugby, practising their passing and catching skills. Finally, the class took part in an important NSPCC assembly all about keeping children safe, discussing how we can keep one another safe in school, outside of school and online. All in all, a great start to the year!

In Year 6

Year 6 have come back to school and are getting used to being the oldest and hopefully the most sensible children at school. Some have done their first guided tour of the school to prospective parents.

We are learning about the circulatory system in Science finding out about the heart and the function of blood.

Our History topic is all about the history of Africa, including colonisation and the slave trade which is giving us lots to think about. We are linking our art to this and we will be creating sciences of African landscapes.



<u>Countryfile Ramble Children in Need –</u> 2nd October


We have the first ever Countryfile Ramble Children in Need in our area! This will take place on 2nd October 2022 from Nettlebed.
