Dear Parents and Carers

This has been a difficult newsletter to write as we navigate the very worst thing that could happen to a school community - the tragic loss of one of its precious children. The death of Oscar will leave a lasting imprint on the school and community. At times, the pain is raw and unyielding, but we know that as days, weeks and months pass we will find solace in our memories of Oscar. What I must mention is the great strength and compassion shown by Oscar's family. Mr and Mrs Roome, Duncan and Carole, have been remarkable during these most difficult of times; their thoughts and the care given to others as well as the time they have taken to talk to those who supported Oscar on that Friday have been so kind and so very welcome. They really are the most wonderful family. Therefore, it is easy to understand the outpouring of love the school and wider community have shown them. The flower tributes, messages and offers of support have been awe-inspiring and I know the Roome Family would like me to pass on their grateful thanks. They have felt the community hold them close in their thoughts and they have been especially grateful for the support from parents at the bus stop, as well as all the cards and letters from the school community.

Oscar will feature in our leavers' events, he remains very much part of our Year 6 cohort and has a place in the year book and photographs, and a place in our hearts forever.

Please may I offer my personal thanks for the many offers of support the school has received. Kind messages, cakes, biscuits, hugs, practical help and reassuring smiles have all contributed to the staff feeling supported which in turn helps them to support our children. We know that it is important to offer a degree of normalcy for the children, with opportunities for support intertwined with usual activities. I feel we have achieved a good balance and I am grateful for the presence of our therapy dogs, the educational psychology services, the nursing team as well as the staff team working together to support one another and you, our parents and carers. One of our very talented parents has been a wonderful presence, offering art therapy all week, the outcome of which we will share with the wider community in due course. KESA have also been wonderful in offering funds and signposts to facilitators

who have led an enrichment day for the children today. The opportunities today have gently supported the children in building resilience and have given them the chance to build what we hope will be forever happy school memories. The children have been incredible and have led the way in the healing process through their questions and thoughtful views. We know this is an unusual and significant event and are mindful that as the summer holidays arrive children may process further. I am looking into support that we might be able to offer to any families who feel they might need some advice during the break and will keep you updated.

I have said it often, but I am incredibly proud of this most wonderful school community. Kidmore End really is a very special place. Thank you.

You will be aware that we have some staff changes upcoming in September. I know plans are underway to mark those who are leaving, but it does lead to questions about what our structure will look like as we begin our new academic year in September. You will find below the staffing structure, which has come about after much thought and careful consideration. I have added the names of the support staff who will be with the year groups, at various times, please be aware that the very nature of support staff is to be somewhat flexible in order to meet the evolving needs of the children. You will also see that Mrs Bickerton will be taking up the SENCO role, Mrs Bell will not be continuing with us, and we have recruited a new secretary, Mrs Hamp.

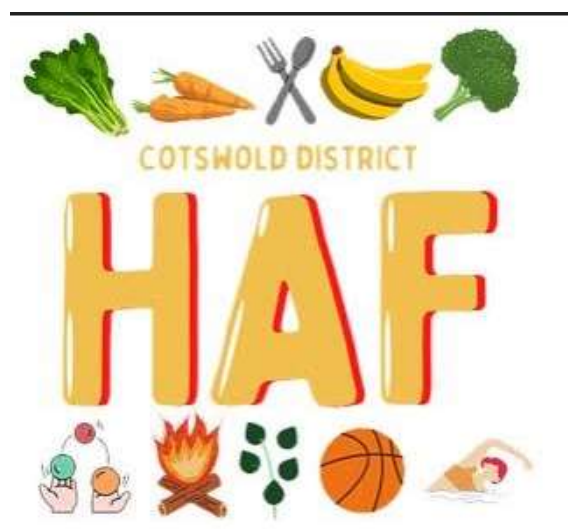
