

# **Kidmore End CE Primary School**



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Dear Parents and Carers,

We hope you all had a lovely, relaxing Easter holiday and are ready for a busy summer term!

We are very much looking forward to our summer topic, 'School Days'. It will provide the children with the opportunity to learn about the history of our school. We will compare schooling and people's lives in the Victorian era to our experiences today. We have a 'School Days' museum box from the Oxfordshire Museum Service, which will bring this learning to life and we will have a **Victorian School Morning on Wednesday 8<sup>th</sup> May** where we will recreate a Victorian classroom in the Year 1 classroom. As part of the role play it would be great if the children could dress up. Girls could wear dark skirts or dresses, white blouses, white aprons, white mop caps or ribbons in their hair. Boys could wear dark or grey shorts, long socks, white shirts, waistcoats, ties and caps. It may be possible to borrow outfits from the current Year 2s who dressed up last year. If the children could come into school that morning in their Victorian clothes and with their PE kit in a bag we will help them change at break time.

In science, our topics are 'Plant Parts' and 'Animal Parts'. The children will grow plants and will learn about animals, including fish, amphibians, reptiles, birds, mammals and invertebrates. They will identify and describe their common structures, their diets and how animals should be cared for.

In our DT project the children will learn about sources of food and the preparatory skills of peeling, tearing, slicing, chopping, mashing and grating. They will use this knowledge to design and make a fresh fruit salad according to specific design criteria. Our art project 'Street View' will focus on the work of the American pop artist, James Rizzi, who depicted streets and buildings. The children will create a 3-D mural based on Rizzi's work.

In Phonics, we will continue to learn new phonemes and practise them ready for the Year 1 Phonics Screening Test in June. In maths we will be focussing on multiplication and division, fractions, geometry, Place Value to 100 and measurement of money and time.
