CHRISTMAS FAIR 2021

Planning is well under way for the exciting return of the Christmas Fair this year. The big date for your diary is Saturday 4th December! The Christmas fair and outside Christmas market will be held between 12 and 3pm. Please look out for an update on parent mail next week with 'need to know' information.



KESA are really looking forward to hosting the school disco again!

Infants disco is held between 5.45pm and 6.45pm Juniors disco is held between 7pm and 8pm.

Tickets cost £3.50 and are available to purchase now. The KESA reps will be in the playground selling tickets (cash and card accepted) on Monday, Wednesday and Friday after school and Thursday before school. Tickets can also be purchased at the entrance to the disco.

Lots of treats including glow sticks, tattoos and sweeties will be available for children to purchase. These cost between 50p and £1. Children are encouraged to bring their own water bottles to refill.

To ensure that the school can accommodate this wonderful event for the children, we have put in place the following COVID control measures and we ask that parents comply with these measures:

- The doors to the hall will be open to give good ventilation. Mr Griffin will be supervising the children and standing on the door.
- To limit numbers inside we ask that only one member of the household collects your child(ren) and that parents wait outside rather than in the corridor at collection, until invited in.
- Parents should wear face masks inside.
- KESA disco volunteers will all take a lateral flow test on the day and show Mr Griffin their result prior to the event.
- Hand sanitiser will be available to children and parents.

Around the school.... In Foundation Stage/Reception

We have had a busy few weeks in Foundation. We are having a wonderful time investigating, discovering and using our imaginations as we explore the new resources. Our favourites being the magnetic water wall and the mud kitchen! A huge thank you to all involved in bringing our outside area to life. We look forward to welcoming children from other year groups to share our explorations and learning adventures.



We enjoyed our visit to Henley Literary Festival which involved listening to some lovely stories but also some singing, dancing and drawing too!

We have been creative this week at the making station, creating habitats for our elephants and the children have designed and created their own patterns based on Elmer ready to add to our crowns for our carnival parade in class next week.



In Year 1

This week we have loved making and painting our three little pig houses! The children have been really creative - we have had drains, boilers and solar panels as great additional features! We have also really enjoyed PE, using the big equipment in the hall for the first time this year.



In English we have been learning about adjectives to describe the wolf in the three little pigs. The children have also been writing a letter from the wolf to the three little pigs which has included a question and a question mark. In maths we have been learning about the < and > symbols. This week we introduced our Year 1 library, the children are enjoying choosing a new book to take home. It is fantastic to see them enjoying their reading.

In Year 2

Year 2 have had some interesting events in the past two weeks. We enjoyed going to Christ church in Henley for the 'Henley Literary festival' and were pleased with the signed books we brought back. We had great fun being taught some new games by Year 6 's 'Active Leaders' and are looking forward to being taught by Year 5's 'Active leaders' this Friday. We have had fun in science finding out which material is the most waterproof, we used flower pots covered with different materials, we poured water in and timed how long it took the water to come through. Foil and plastic were the most waterproof materials we used. We all enjoyed meeting Reverend James in the church on Thursday and learnt a lot about Kidmore End church and what it is like to be a church leader.

In Year 3

Year 3 have been using everything they know about life in the Stone Age to write an adventure story based on life in prehistoric times. They have worked hard to include some fantastic expanded noun phrases to add detailed description. In science, they learnt some new vocabulary: transparent, translucent and opaque and carried out an investigation to test materials to test for transparency. In maths they have developed their mental calculation strategies and used these to solve problems.
