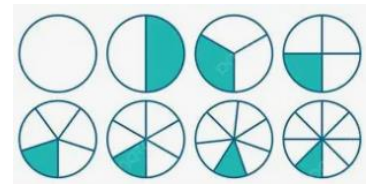

You could pick one, or try a few – the choice is yours.</p> <p>Science</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Grow your one plant diary - grow a plant (beans or sunflowers) and record progress. This can be through drawings, photos, sentences, measurements. - Design a perfect plant poster - design your own 'ideal plant'. Label your plant (roots, stem, leaves, flower), explain what each part does and include any creative features. <p>Topic</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Seaside shoebox diorama - create a mini beach scene inside a shoebox. - A day at the seaside diary - write and draw a simple diary as if you spent a day by the coast.
